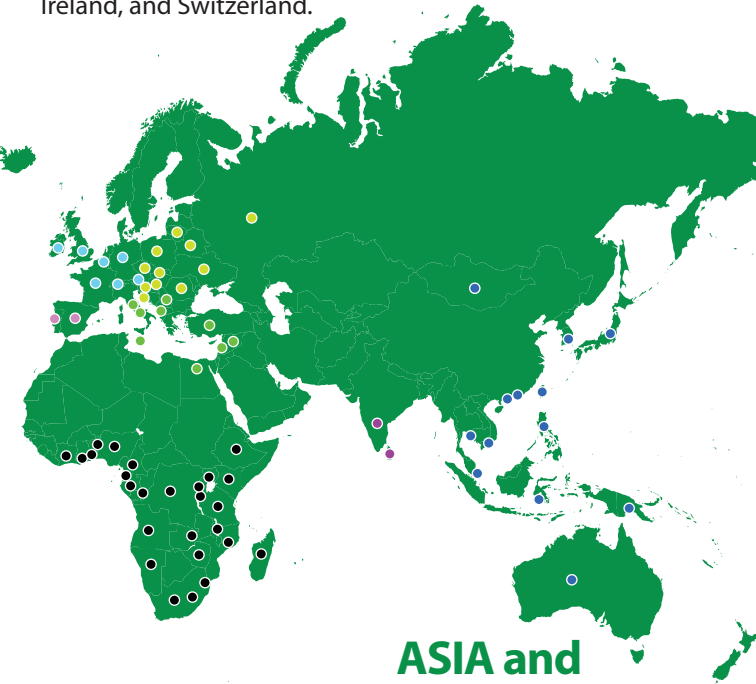

OUR STORY

Don Bosco (1815-1888) was a practical and enterprising man, an untiring and creative worker who committed all his energies to a vast apostolic project for the human and Christian education of the young. Certain of having been called by God to this mission, he founded oratories and academic and technical schools; found work for the young; and gave entire life for the evangelisation in his country and in the Missions.

From the beginning, in order to give life to his apostolic project, he involved many lay people, men and women, and united them in an association: the Salesian Cooperators (1876).

He traced out a rule of spiritual life. It's authentic spirit life whose authentic spirit and purpose can be found in the Project of Apostolic Life (PVA). It describes the characteristics of the Salesian Spirit, underlining the Gospel values of: strong pastoral charity, youthful dynamism, sensus ecclesiae, family spirit, optimism, and joy...



WHAT WE DO

We commit ourselves to respond to our Salesian Vocation, which is a gift of the Spirit, taking on a specific way of living the Gospel and participating in the mission of the Church.
